The last 12 months have been filled with awards, accolades, and accomplishments for Patrick & Henry Community College.

The college began the year by winning the workforce development award from the Community Colleges of Appalachia. This was soon followed by a \$210,000 grant from the Virginia Tobacco Region Revitalization Committee to create a Healthcare Skills Lab which allows for the expansion of Nurse Aide training. Additionally, the college was awarded \$70,000 from the State Council of Higher Education in Virginia (SCHEV) to launch a new initiative intended to maximize retention of at-risk minority populations. Moreover, we had the privilege of opening two new facilities: The Patrick County Fab Lab and The Gerald L. Baliles and Richard S. Reynolds, Sr. Learning Center.

We were deeply honored to learn that Patrick & Henry Community College was named by the readers of The Martinsville Bulletin as "The Best Place to Work in Martinsville and Henry County." I will add that I believe it is also the best place to learn and be trained for a good paying job with family sustaining wages! 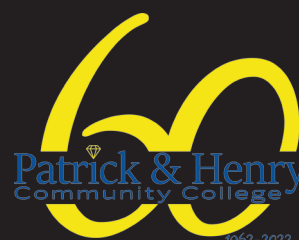

Saralynn Craddock Edens Establishes Scholarship Fund Through Planned Gift

Saralynn Edens has recently made a deferred gift to establish the Saralynn Craddock Edens Scholarship Fund at Patrick & Henry Community College Foundation. Edens established the fund to help ease the financial burden for students as they pursue their passions and train for the future.



Adopted in 1960, Saralynn grew up in Collinsville and attended Collinsville Primary, John Redd Elementary, and Fieldale-Collinsville High School, graduating in 1979. She always planned on going to college and had been accepted by Radford and Virginia Tech, but found it was not financially viable. So, she chose to start her college education in the fall of '79 at P&HCC.

After completing her A.S. Education in 1981, her career direction changed, and she enrolled in P&HCC's new Computer Science program. Edens found herself immersed in an extremely robust, comprehensive, multi-language curriculum which gave her excellent exposure to the hottest needs in the mainframe programming industry (Fortran, RPG, JCL, SAS, Assembler, and COBOL.) She had TWO job offers before she graduated in May 1983! She took the South Carolina offer and was gainfully working as a programmer by September 1983.

While working in South Carolina, she went on to earn her B.A. from College of Charleston which opened more doors for career growth. Edens states, "However, it was truly the A.S. in Computer Science from P&HCC that gave me the skills to earn a terrific salary and continually evolve with our ever-changing technology. It was my 'bread and butter' for 20 years – IBM mainframes, LAN systems, telecommunications systems, learning web-based languages to build systems that went from laptops to servers, upload via telecommunication scripts, mainframe processing, download for LAN database reintegration. It was all fascinating and challenging!"

Edens and her husband, James (Jim), did not have children. However, when reviewing their yearly tax bills, regardless of their current location, it was clear that a large portion of their taxes were going to education. "We thought that was SUPER!", says Edens. "We were more than happy to support education with our tax dollars as we both have very high regards for the powerful benefits of a good, solid education. We both grew up in rural areas with limited job opportunities and our college education gave us freedom to follow our dreams. We've traveled, mentored, and invested wisely."

After 20 years of Systems Programming/Analysis and Quality Assurance testing, Edens turned in her IBM beeper and earned her E-RYT200 (Experienced Yoga Teacher 200 hour) certification. "My analytical skills were great for writing yoga lessons. I even developed my own 'yoga code' to build my lesson plans," said Edens.

Edens planned gift qualifies her as a member of the Patrick & Henry Society, which honors donors who have designated Patrick & Henry Community College in their will, trust, or other planned gifts. Members of the Patrick & Henry Society have made a vital commitment to the future of the college and have also set an inspiring example for others.

On her contribution, she states "my hope is to offer as many people as possible the opportunity to earn a degree that will enhance their opportunities for gainful employment and be of service to their communities. We are in this together and we must look out for each other ALWAYS!"

The Patriots Society honors those who have designated Patrick & Henry Community College as the recipient of a named gift. The Patriots Society now includes 31 named giving benefactors with gifts totaling \$11.8 million since the inception of the program more than 26 years ago.



Donation Over \$70,000 Establishes Wanda Ayers-Slate Nursing Scholarship

Living and working in Patrick County for nearly seven decades, Wanda Ayers-Slate made an impact in her community. Working as a Registered Nurse in Patrick County for twenty years, she touched countless lives. Now, even after her passing, Ayers-Slate continues to impact the lives of Patrick County residents.

With a donation of more than \$70,000, the family will establish the Wanda Ayers-Slate Nursing Scholarship. The money, which was donated to the Patrick County Education Foundation (PCEF), will be used to establish an endowed scholarship fund at the Patrick & Henry Community College Foundation. The fund will provide two \$1,000 awards to Patrick County residents pursuing a degree in nursing at Patrick & Henry Community College. The scholarship will be offered for the first time starting in the Fall of 2022 and will be distributed annually.

“Those of us who knew Wanda Ayers-Slate as a friend, high school classmate, or as a patron of her successful business in uptown Stuart, are inspired still by her entrepreneurial spirit through this very generous gift to Patrick County. Wanda’s family and estate will continue to lift the condition of the community through this substantial investment in the nursing profession, where she had her first opportunity to demonstrate her genuine care for others. On behalf of the PCEF Board, I express our heartfelt appreciation for this wonderful commitment to Patrick County and its future nurses,” stated Stewart Roberson, Patrick County Education Foundation Chair.

Representing the Ayers-Slate family and estate, Britt Williams of Schneider & Williams, P.C. said, “Wanda was a wonderful woman who consistently gave back to our community throughout her lifetime, and will continue to do so through ‘The Wanda Ayers-Slate Nursing Scholars’ grant. Harvest announces \$10.3 million grant to P&HCC guaranteeing SEED for today's kindergarten students

The Harvest Foundation today announced on September 30, 2021 a 13-year, \$10.3 million grant to Patrick & Henry Community College (P&HCC) to support the SEED Fund, which will ensure a college education is available at no cost to every high school graduate in Martinsville-Henry County.

“The SEED Fund makes us the envy of many communities across our country,” said Bill Kirby, chairman of The Harvest Foundation Board of Directors. “It gives us an edge on the competition when our economic developers are recruiting, and it gives our children a concrete goal to strive toward from an early age.”

The SEED Fund was established at P&HCC in 2017 as a three-year pilot program. Since the inception of the program, the first two cohorts of SEED students are completing college at a rate that is double the national average for community college students. Fall to spring retention rates increased by six percent while fall to fall retention rates increased by sixteen percent. SEED students are staying in school and earning credentials at higher rates than their counterparts.

“There are many of us here today who are not educators,” said Kate Keller, president of The Harvest Foundation. “But we all know the commitment, effort, and resources it takes to be a college graduate. We also know the earning power and positive outcomes that benefit those with a college education. For many

students, the desire to attend college is there, they just need reassurance that it is possible and within their reach. The SEED Fund gives them that reassurance and hope.”

According to Dr. Greg Hodges, president of P&HCC, this is the largest investment in history at P&HCC, but it is also much more.

“It is an investment in the power of hope for a better future for our community,” Hodges said. “Starting today, the question of ‘can I afford to go to college’ will never again be asked by a school-age student in Martinsville-Henry County. As of this moment, the financial barrier of attending college has been removed for an entire generation.”

The announcement ended with the planting of a dogwood tree as a symbol for this year's kindergarten class.

“We hope when these kindergartners grow up and become SEED students, they will visit this very spot and reflect on their educational journeys, and dream about their futures,” Keller said.

The Director of Education for the Gene Haas Foundation, Kathy Looman, says that supporting P&HCC aligns with the foundation's mission "to expose students to careers in manufacturing and to provide scholarships to the students who choose a career in CNC machining and/or manufacturing engineering."

According to Looman, support for this particular demographic is crucial because "53% of high school students don't believe they will have an opportunity to have a good job." The Gene Haas Foundation believes that scholarships for manufacturing programs specifically are particularly important. Nationally, these jobs are in high demand. And, according to the Bureau of Labor Statistics, that demand is likely going to continue growing.

According to P&HCC officials, this support is also critical because scholarships often play a pivotal role in a student's decision and ability to pursue a field of interest.

"Many of our students would not be able to complete their training without these scholarships," says Tiffani Underwood, the Executive Director of the P&HCC Foundation. "We are so grateful for the continued support from the Gene Haas Foundation. Their commitment to student development in these high-demand career fields ensures our community has the highly skilled employees needed to be successful."

The Gene Haas Foundation was founded in 1999 by the owner of Haas Automation, Inc., America's leading builder of CNC machine tools. To promote American manufacturing and manufacturing education, the Haas Foundation has donated more than 120 million dollars to over 4500 charitable organizations and schools.

On December 7, 2021, Patrick & Henry Community College held a dedication event for its training facility in Patrick County. The college unveiled the new name which honors two major donors.

The college officially began using the space in 2019 to expand its offerings in Patrick County. P&HCC dedicated the space to commemorate the donors who have not only made the expansion possible but have also been avid supporters of the college's efforts to create accessible education in Patrick County.

The space officially received its new name: The Gerald L. Baliles and Richard S. Reynolds, Sr. Learning Center. For short, the college anticipates people will refer to it as the Baliles & Reynolds Learning Center.

For the last year, P&HCC has been using the Baliles & Reynolds Learning Center to house its electrical groundsman, commercial driver license, and mechatronics programs –all of which were identified as high-demand career fields by local business leaders and county officials. The training space is roughly 5,000 square feet and is located directly across the street from the college's initial Patrick County facility. The space and its dedication have been made possible with the partnership of the P&HCC Foundation and the Patrick County Education Foundation.
