Judge Covington, 87, earned his bachelor's degree from Bluefield College and his law degree from the University of Richmond. He served as Henry County Commonwealth Attorney for 12 years and retired as a Henry County Circuit Court Judge. Covington is a U.S. Army Korean War veteran, earning the Bronze Star for meritorious service.

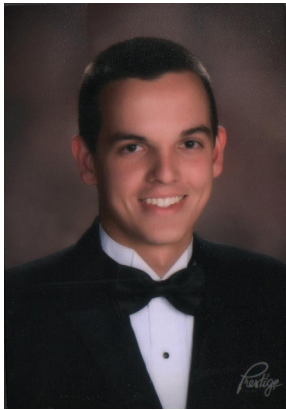
