The 2024-2025 academic year was once again full of honors, awards, and accomplishments for Patrick & Henry Community College.

The success of the college has been noticed across the community, Commonwealth of Virginia, and country. For example, P&HCC was honored to win the prestigious national Advising Success Network award from the Student Choice Awards for Holistic Advising Excellence in Advising Services. Among many other awards, P&HCC received \$150,000 from the State Council of Higher Education of Virginia (SCHEV) and VTOP (Virginia Talent Opportunity Partnership) to expand Work-Based Learning opportunities.

The college had a strong year of instituting new programs and initiatives. Thanks to the generosity of the Ratcliffe Foundation, which provided a grant for \$176,267, P&HCC was able to launch a new heavy equipment operator program at the P&HCC Baliles & Reynolds Learning Center in Patrick County. Additionally, a grant from the Virginia Tobacco Region Revitalization Commission allowed the college to partner with The Franklin Center in Franklin County to launch a nurse aide program and provide certifications in phlebotomy and certified medical assisting. To further demonstrate our college's commitment to regional economic development, P&HCC signed an MOU with the Henry County Adult Detention Center to become the training provider for the region's justice-impacted population.

As wonderful as it is for the college to be recognized nationally, we are even more passionate about the impact we are having locally. We are thrilled that our enrollment growth continued for a third year with a 5.1% increase in the total number of students served from the previous year. It is important to note that this is the first time in 20 years that P&HCC has experienced three years of total enrollment growth. For academic year 24-25, 515 academic students (a 13% increase over the previous year) earned 714 academic credentials (a 13% increase over the previous year) with 234 of these students (a 17.5% increase over the previous year) participating in our May 17 commencement ceremony.

We remain so very grateful for the continued support of our donors. Simply put, we could not fulfill our mission of economic mobility without these resources. Every gift enables us to provide students what they need in order for them and their families to experience financial stability. P&HCC is honored to be our community's education and training provider helping to ensure a very bright future for our service region.

As always, it is the honor of my lifetime to serve as the president of Patrick & Henry Community College.

As we look ahead to another year of growth and opportunity at Patrick & Henry Community College, I'm reminded of Margaret Mead's words: "Never doubt that a small group of thoughtful, committed citizens can change the world; indeed, it's the only thing that ever has." That spirit of working together is at the heart of the Patrick & Henry Community College Foundation. Every scholarship, every resource, every opportunity our students receive is possible because of you—our donors, partners, faculty, and friends. Together, we are not only helping our students pursue an education but also create lasting change that strengthens our whole community.

P&HCC Receives TRRC Grant for Building Trades Expansion

Patrick & Henry Community College (P&HCC) is one of five community colleges awarded a Tobacco Region Revitalization Commission (TRRC) grant for workforce training programs. P&HCC will use the \$129,527 grant for expanded electrician training via a mobile training lab.

P&HCC has experienced great growth in both employer demand and enrollment in building trades programming in the last two years, and is working on planned expansions of multiple building trades training programs. P&HCC will bring training to students with barriers that prevent or make it difficult to travel to the college's main campus. TRRC funding will support equipment needed to offer expanded electrician training and Greenlee/NC3 certifications. This equipment will be housed in an existing mobile trailer and will be used at P&HCC's Patrick County site, The Franklin Center, and to serve the Henry County Adult Detention Center, in conjunction with classroom space at each location. Students participating in training in the mobile lab can earn up to 11 industry recognized certifications.

"P&HCC began offering training with embedded Greenlee certification programming in April 2023 and has had great success with the program," said P&HCC Vice President for Workforce, Economic, and Community Development Rhonda Hodges, adding, "We anticipate being able to serve 40 students each year through the mobile lab."

In addition to preparing electricians to work in the P&HCC service region, localities will benefit from the mobile lab's opportunity for more accessible training. This is particularly beneficial for residents of Patrick and Franklin County, many of whom may be prevented from receiving training due to transportation barriers. For incarcerated individuals in the Henry County Adult Detention Center, it represents an opportunity to earn training that is otherwise entirely inaccessible to them. For all participants, this training will provide training and industry recognized certifications for an in-demand career path. Individuals with electrical training will positively impact a variety of building trades employers, who report the need for trained employees, in all localities.

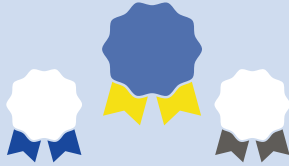

P&HCC Building Trades Academy Expansion Underway; Classes to Continue During Renovation

Patrick & Henry Community College is proud to announce the expansion of its Building Trades Academy, reinforcing its longstanding commitment to workforce development and hands-on career training. The \$2.6 million project, funded by the Workforce Pipeline Funds of the Virginia Community College System (VCCS), will enhance the Academy's training capacity while maintaining uninterrupted learning for current students.

The Building Trades Academy has long served as a vital resource for individuals pursuing careers in skilled trades, providing industry-relevant instruction and hands-on experience in fields such as electrical, plumbing, HVAC, and carpentry. This expansion will modernize existing facilities, introduce new state-of-the-art equipment, and increase classroom and lab space to accommodate a growing student body.

"This expansion will allow us to serve more students and better prepare them for high-demand careers in the skilled trades in the communities served by P&HCC, all while continuing to deliver quality education throughout the renovation process," said P&HCC President Dr. Greg Hodges.

Construction is set to be completed by June 2026, and all programs and classes will continue on a regular schedule during the renovation period.



P&HCC Awarded Grant Funds for Heavy Equipment Operator Program Expansion

Patrick & Henry Community College has been awarded a \$176,267.00 grant from the Philip E. & Carole R. Ratcliffe Foundation to increase Heavy Equipment Operator (HEO) training programming by offering HEO courses in Patrick County.

“We are pleased to partner with Patrick & Henry Community College to provide resources for the Heavy Equipment Operator Training program in Patrick County that will equip individuals with technical skills to meet the labor demands for the statewide road expansion and improvement projects,” said Carlene Cassidy, CEO of the Ratcliffe Foundation. “Patrick & Henry CC has demonstrated a strong commitment to workforce training. We are confident that they will build on their current programs to set the next generation of learners up for success in their chosen fields and support the workforce needs of multiple employers throughout the region. Making education and skilled trades training accessible and supporting local business & industry are goals our founders wholeheartedly supported.”

P&HCC currently offers Heavy Equipment Operator training at its Manufacturing, Engineering, and Technology (MET) Complex in Martinsville. With funding from the Ratcliffe Foundation, the college will expand its current programming to its satellite site in Patrick County to lessen the burden of transportation for students and to train future workers to serve on the large-scale project currently underway on Route 58.

“Having access to a pipeline of workers prepared to work as equipment operators will be an asset on numerous projects throughout the state,” said Robbie Williams, Branch project executive, adding, “In particular, this training project will greatly assist with the current project underway to widen the road on Route 58 in Patrick County, Virginia as well as upcoming projects in the area.”

The Virginia Employment Commission shows that there are currently 10,015 individuals employed as construction equipment operators across the state. By 2030, this number is expected to grow to 10,894, a growth of nearly 10%. Because of job transfers and individuals retiring or switching professions, there are currently 1,180 openings posted for construction equipment operators annually. According to JobsEq data, operating engineers and other

construction equipment operators earn an average of \$49,100 per year, with more experienced workers earning more than \$55,200 per year.

“With funding from the Ratcliffe Foundation, we will have the funds to purchase simulators that play a critical role in training students before they transition to practice on real-life machinery. There are multiple benefits to training on simulators: learning on simulators reduces accidents by allowing students to train in a safe and relaxed environment, students can practice extreme situations and operations without risking injury or machine damage, producing and running a simulator leaves a minimal climate footprint compared to a traditional machine running on fossil fuels, and simulators allow students to gain more hours in the machine or vehicle regardless of season and weather,” said retired P&HCC Vice President for Workforce, Economic and Community Development Rhonda Hodges.

Interested students must first complete the National Center for Construction Education & Research (NCCER) Introductory Craft Skills program, which is a prerequisite course. NCCER Heavy Equipment Operator (HEO) Level 1 training covers a variety of critical skills for those working in the field including orientation to the trade, heavy equipment safety, identification of heavy equipment, basic operational techniques, utility tractors, introduction to earthmoving, grades, and vertical-mast sit-down counterbalance forklifts.

While uniquely aligned with the current road-widening project, the training prepares participants for a variety of positions within the construction trades industry that are in high-demand in P&HCC's service region.



Community College Philanthropists Honored with Chancellor's Award for Leadership in Philanthropy

Mr. Darrell Bowling, of Stuart, Virginia, has received the 19th Annual Chancellor's Award for Leadership in Philanthropy. He was nominated for the award by Patrick & Henry Community College (P&HCC).

Hosted by the Virginia Foundation for Community College Education (VFCCE), more than two dozen individuals, families, and organizations were honored with the Chancellor's Award for Leadership in Philanthropy. The awards were presented at a luncheon ceremony in Richmond on Tuesday, April 15. VCCS Chancellor Dr. David Doré served as the emcee, and Mr. Mark Hourigan, founder and CEO of Hourigan, delivered the keynote address.

"Every time our donors support a scholarship, fund a new program, or an emergency grant, they are not just giving back, they are lifting up," said Hourigan. "They are invaluable partners whose generosity can and does make the difference between a student dropping out or staying the course and realizing their true potential."

Doré echoed those sentiments, adding that a culture of care can have a profound impact on student performance. "When our students realize that someone cares enough to help remove the formidable obstacles standing in their way, it's life-changing," he said. "The

things they thought impossible suddenly become doable, and their confidence soars as a result."

This year's class of distinguished philanthropy leaders has collectively contributed \$24 million dollars to Virginia's Community Colleges.

Thanks to Bowling, motorcyclists from across the country have gathered in Patrick County for the annual Cpl. Jonathan W. Bowling Memorial Bike Ride for 20 years. The annual memorial motorcycle ride is both a way for fellow veterans and servicemen to remember fallen Marine Jonathan Williams Bowling and a chance for these men and women to continue his legacy of giving back to the community. The Corporal Jonathan W. Bowling Memorial fund has provided money for two Patrick County students to attend P&HCC each year since 2004.

"P&HCC has been honored to partner with the Bowling family to preserve Corporal Bowling's memory in this way," said Tiffani Underwood, Director of P&HCC's Foundation, adding, "We are so grateful for Darrell's work to make the annual ride such a success and for his dedication to ensuring Patrick County students have the opportunity to work toward their goals at P&HCC."

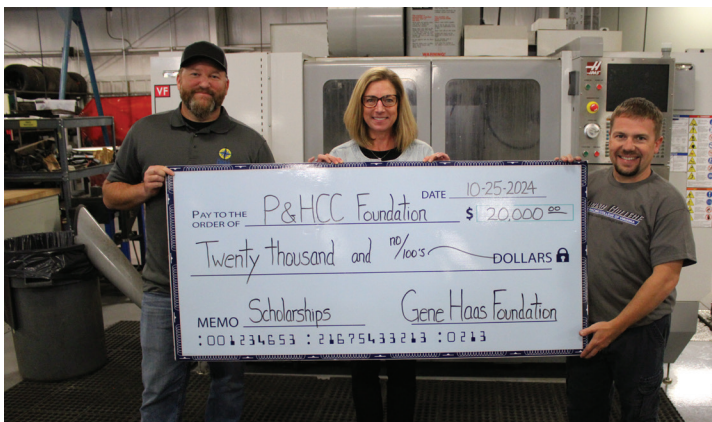
P&HCC Receives Gene Haas Foundation Grant

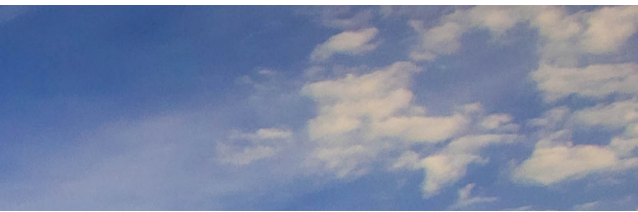
