PHCC Foundation Receives Harvest Award

Patrick Henry Community College (PHCC) received a three-year grant totaling \$3.1 million from the Harvest Foundation to strengthen Martinsville and Henry County's workforce and develop future career pipelines. We would like to thank them for their partnership and the value that they see in PHCC

enable students to identify and move forward on a career pathway as early as possible, focusing on degree and career-ready certifications and credentials."

An estimated 250 students will have the opportunity to take advantage of this program in its first year, serving 2018 high school, homeschool and GED graduates. PHCC will track progress of students in the program, noting the number of credentials and certifications earned, seeing how many students transfer to four-year institutions, and keeping track of students entering the workforce employed in a living wage job.

"Harvest SEED is ground breaking," said Dr. Angeline Godwin, president of PHCC. "By investing in our community's education, Harvest is cultivating the lives and futures of these high school students. By investing in today's students, they are investing in tomorrow's workforce. The lasting impact this will have on the lives of each student and on Martinsville and Henry County is immeasurable. When these high school graduates join the workforce as college graduates, our whole community will feel the impact."

House added, "Growing and supporting our area's workforce is a top priority for Harvest, and we're proud to partner with PHCC and provide resources that will move our community forward."

The grant, Harvest SEED (Student Excellence in Education), makes the first two years of college at PHCC free of charge for all residents of Martinsville-Henry County who graduate during the 2017-2018 academic year. Funding is last-dollar for student tuition throughout the three-year pilot.

The Harvest SEED program benefits from PHCC's existing infrastructure and experience to expand the college's programming to incorporate future workforce development, and it will develop skilled workers to fill current vacancies throughout the workforce.

"Patrick Henry Community College fills a vital role in our community of training and preparing individuals in Martinsville and Henry County to enter the workforce or move onto four-year universities," said DeWitt House, senior program officer at Harvest Foundation. "Harvest SEED will

FOUNDATION HIGHLIGHTS

- > The foundation accounted for 14% of the college's operating budget. A total of \$1,943,312 was provided, with \$771,659 awarded in scholarships. Other major areas funded by the foundation include faculty and staff positions, technology advancement, equipment, Student Art Show awards, and a number of special college projects.
- > \$1,536,810 was raised through:
 - \$1,521,253 in cash
 - \$4,390 in pledges
 - \$11,167 in in-kind contributions
- > The total amount of cash contributions, not including pledges, received by the PHCC Foundation from its first organized fund-raising activities in 1983 to the end of FY 2018 reached \$33.5 million.
- > The value of foundation net assets totaled over \$19 million as of June 30, 2018.
- > The value of endowed scholarships was \$9.2 million.
- > The Patriots Society now includes 28 named giving benefactors with gifts totaling \$11.7 million since the inception of the program.
- > The Patrick Henry Society for planned giving donors now numbers 34 with the value of deferred gifts at \$6.4 million.

Dalton graduated from PHCC in 1992 with her associate in nursing. She is now a New Patient Coordinator, melanoma for Duke Cancer Center.

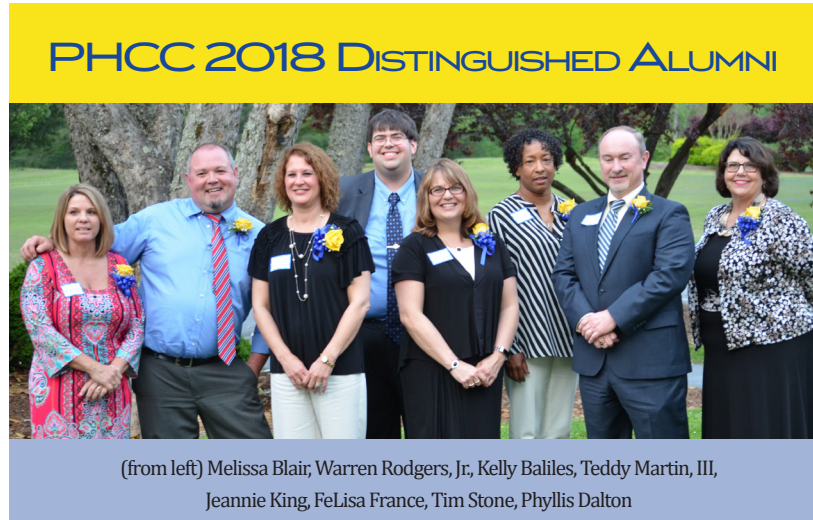

Verizon Innovative Learning Camp for Girls



Virtual Reality became reality for our Verizon Girls.

In 2018, Patrick Henry Community College was awarded a grant from the National Association for Community College Entrepreneurship to implement the Verizon Innovative Learning Program for Girls, after a successful pilot launch in 2017. Approximately one hundred girls from Martinsville, Henry and Patrick Counties are participating in the program which began with a three week summer camp held at the Dalton IDEA Center and at the Patrick County PHCC Site for participants in Patrick County. The year-long program encourages middle school girls to get involved in STEM (Science, Technology, Engineering and Math) by teaching them skills in four core areas: Design Thinking, Virtual Reality, 3D Design/Printing and Coding.

During the camp, the girls also participated in mentoring sessions each day provided by local female leaders, female entrepreneurs and females who work in a STEM field. "As they meet women who inspire them, they can see themselves one day in their shoes. It is incredible to watch when

that light goes off in their eyes and they suddenly realize that they can do anything," says Tiffani Underwood, Interim Executive Director of the PHCC Foundation.

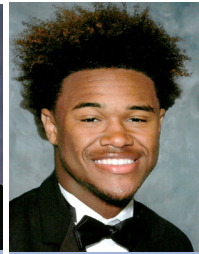
